Where would you place your mentoring program's work in the domain of Evaluation on the continuum below?

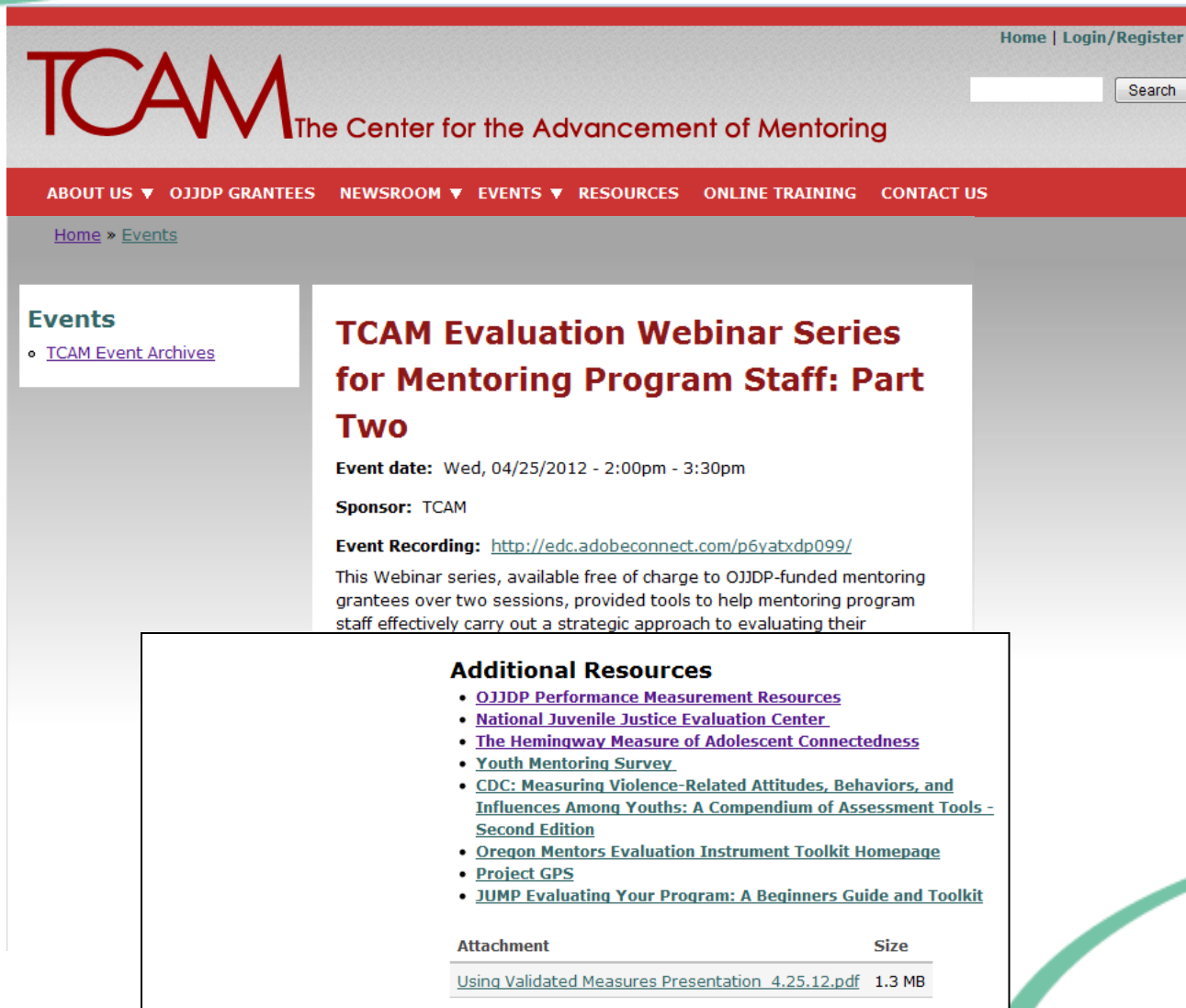

SESSION FOUR: Sustainability and Strategic Funding

This session encourages participants to take a creative approach to finding funds to sustain the key functions of their mentoring program. After prioritizing and examining how other strategies can promote sustainability without another grant, this will be an opportunity for program managers and other participants to think about new approaches to fundraising and finance.

Learning objectives – by the end of this session, participants will be able to:

WORKSHEETS/ACTIVITIES

- **Action Planning Worksheet:** You can continue to use this worksheet as you expand your sustainability planning to include the financing of prioritized program activities
- **Tree Branch Philosophy:** This worksheet from Cuidiu Consulting is a way for programs to create a visual representation of the services they offer, and identify how they are interconnected or grow out of one another.
- **In-House Assets Worksheet:** This worksheet from Cuidiu Consulting helps programs evaluate their activities and map out which ones have value as a publicly supported service, a collaborative service, or a charitable service, as well as those activities that have not proven their value.
- **TCAM Sustainability Wheel:** The six strategies mapped out here can be used to sustain key mentoring program activities or functions, so that you can continue achieving your mentoring-related outcomes.
- **Sample Budget Worksheet:** This budget spreadsheet can be used to get a realistic picture of financial needs and current funding sources, and to calculate a target amount for fundraising purposes.
