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# Evaluation Requirements During No-Cost Extension Year

- ◆ Form ED 524B
  - Same as usual
- ◆ Final Evaluation Report
  - Comprehensive report
  - Due 90 days after funding ends



# The Final Evaluation Report

- ◆ Include Section on Sustainability
  - Programs/Services/Activities
  - Systems Changes
  - Partnerships/Relationships
  - Evaluation
- ◆ Include Section on Lessons Learned
  - Project Director Perspective
  - Program Staff Perspective
  - School Administrator Perspective
  - Evaluator Perspective

# Potential Changes During No-Cost Extension Year


- ◆ Evaluation Scope/Budget
- ◆ Evaluation Goals and Priorities
- ◆ Evaluation Process



# Evaluation During No-Cost Extension Year

## ◆ Evaluation Scope/Budget


- What % of a full-year budget will remain for the no-cost year?
- Which programs/services/activities will remain in place and which will go away?
- Do you need to save \$\$ during final full year in order to fund evaluation during no-cost year?
  - Shift data collection responsibilities to others?
  - Move to online surveys, especially if only basic data analysis is needed
  - Streamline evaluation of particular programs/services/activities



# Evaluation During No-Cost Extension Year

## ◆ Evaluation Goals and Priorities

- Goals usually shift to focus on sustainability
- There is often a heavier emphasis on outcome data vs. process data
- There may be an interest in cost data
- May need to focus evaluation resources on specific programs of interest



# Evaluation During No-Cost Extension Year

## ◆ Evaluation Process

- Start thinking about no-cost year during the final full year of grant
- Talk with PD about goals/priorities, especially regarding sustainability
- Who are the decision-makers, and what kind of data will be compelling to them?
- Talk with other stakeholders regarding data they need to support or advocate for a program

# Evaluation During No-Cost Extension Year

## ◆ Evaluation Process

- If you already have good quantitative data, do you need to supplement it with interview and/or focus group data?
- How can you report evaluation findings most effectively?
  - Full evaluation report
  - Brief written reports or fact sheets
  - Presentations/Discussions with decision-makers
