Basic Needs/Safety



Currently: Fragmentation

- No universal access to collaborative services
- Not all schools have outreach consultants
 - Some having to supplement salaries
- No standardized early identification process at all school sites
- Inconsistent training for outreach consultants and school staff

Looking at the future: Coordination

- Universal access to collaborative services
- Outreach consultants at each site
- Standardization of identification process to meet student needs
- Standardized training for outreach consultants and other support staff (COST and SST processes)

Basic Needs

- No universal access to case management services
- Points of access are not coordinated:
 - Two collaboratives different district departments and community partners

- Universal access to case management services
- One point of access to all services
 (simplified, direct and economical)



School Safety

- Not all sites have a trained crisis response person
- Only three schools implementing Positive Action (Bullying prevention and character education)
- SRO presence at Middle schools

- All ORCs trained as a school crisis response team leader
- All ORCs will update school crisis response procedures
- ORCs will be trained as trainers on Positive Action Curriculum
- SROs will be sustained through partnerships and grants

Health Services

- Office staff responsible for health insurance campaign
- Some schools utilizing lice clinics
- Some schools utilizing COST process to address needs
- No data system to track services

- Consultant to evaluate status of services available at school sites through nurses and health assistants
- Improved health insurance enrollment campaign coordinated by ORCs and principals
- Easy electronic referral process for all teachers
- Universal access to lice and Immunization services through COST
- Data base System in place



Mental Health Services

- Some schools contract with local service providers
- Services target 12 to 15 students per school
- Universal access to mental health services
- Services will increase to target
 30 to 40 students at each site
- No schools will have to use site funding
