



Total oil in each capsule (Includes non-essential oils)	Cost	EPA (Eicosapentanoic acid in each capsule)	DHA (Docosaphexanonic acid in each capsule)	EPA + DHA	# of capsules needed
1,000 mg (Unconcentrated cod liver oil)	\$	180 mg	120 mg	300 mg	2,100 mg 7 caps per day
1,000 mg (molecularly distilled	\$\$	300 mg	200 mg	500 mg	2,000 mg 4 caps per day
1,100 mg (highly purified)	\$\$\$	600 mg	400 mg	1,000 mg	2,000 mg 2 caps per day


- More effective than selective reuptake inhibitors in depression treatment


