Local Evaluations

Cross-Site Evaluation

- Annual site visits
- Biannual web-based data collection
- Synthesis of rigorous local evaluations

Federal Reporting Requirements

- GPRA performance measures
- Mid-year and end-of-year progress reports
- TRAC and parent surveys (under development)

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






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


Project LAUNCH Uses A Public Health Approach

- Is systems-based
- Relies on a social ecological model
- Uses tiered prevention strategies (universal, indicated, promotion)
- Seeks to reduce risk factors and increase protective factors
- Assumes population change requires multiple strategies working together at the community level





Project LAUNCH Cross-site Evaluation Framework



Types of LAUNCH Grantee Activities:

Activities to promote systems changes at State/Tribal level

Activities to promote systems changes at local community level

Service delivery activities in the local child and family service system





Activities to Promote Systems Changes

- Child Wellness Councils (State/Tribal & local)
- Coordination of programs, supports, services
- Policy development
- Raising awareness of child wellness
- Changes in financing of programs & services
- Organizational restructuring





Activities to Enhance Local Services

New/expanded services in 5 strands


Adoption of evidence-based practices to change risk and protective factors for children and families

Service delivery that is family-centered, culturally competent

CSE Evaluation Research Questions: Context and Systems

- Context at the State/Tribal and local levels
- Changes initiated by LAUNCH in infrastructure, legislation and other policies at the State/Tribal and local community levels
- Systems outcomes of these changes





CSE Evaluation Research Questions: Services

Child or family services initiated/ enhanced by LAUNCH in the 5 strands

Service system outcomes

- Adoption of high-quality, evidence-based practices implemented with fidelity to program models
- Services that reach the identified target population
- Workforce that is better trained and supported to address children's mental and behavioral health





CSE Evaluation Research Questions: Impacts on Children and Families

Impact of local evidence-based practices on children and parents

Community-wide effect on the physical, cognitive, social, emotional, and behavioral health of young children



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CSE Data Collection: Site Visits

- Fall of each year to each grantee
- Three broad topics covered
 - Context at State/Tribal and local levels
 - Systems changes
 - Service delivery
 - Implementation challenges
 - Fidelity of implementation to selected evidencebased model or best practice
 - Progress towards adoption/maintenance of evidence-based model or best practices





- Data entry semi-annually (October & April)
- Varying schedule of data collection
 - Systems measures collected annually
 - Services measures collected semiannually
- First data collection for Cohort 2: Fall 2010





- Systems and systems changes in the state/Tribe/community
- Services planned and delivered in 5 strands
- Outcomes of services
 - Families reached
 - Services delivered
 - Providers trained
 - Demographics of children and families served.



- Data on systems and systems changes at the state/Tribe/community levels
 - Composition and achievements of Councils on Young Child Wellness
 - Collaborative partners in LAUNCH
 - Implementation factors (challenges & facilitators)
 - Accomplishments of Project LAUNCH activities
 - Program outreach or public awareness activities
 - Workforce development activities
 - Quality monitoring and evaluation activities
 - Strategies to ensure sustainability





Data on services and service delivery

- Services supported by LAUNCH
- Target groups for each service: # and characteristics of children and families to be served,
- # and types of providers and provider settings to deliver the services
- # of children/families served
- # of providers and their settings involved in delivering services
- # of providers trained and changes that providers report in their practices and work settings


Fidelity of implementation of services



Questions and Discussion

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CSE Data Collection: Synthesis of Impacts on Children and Families

- Data about effects of local services on children and families, collected by grantees
 - Collected only if local evaluators are implementing experimental or quasiexperimental designs
- Data about community-wide effects on population outcomes
 - CSE will work with grantees to develop options



SAMHSA Data Collection Needs

Federal reporting requirements

- GPRA measures: to be collected via the web portal twice a year as part of systems and services measures
- TRAC measures: Prevention and Infrastructure domains (under development)
- Parent surveys (completed at end of service)
- Mid-year and end-of-year grantee progress reports (including local evaluation report findings)
