

Government Performance and Results Act

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What is GPRA?

- Federal statute requiring all Federal agencies manage their activities with attention to the consequences of those activities
- Intent:
 - Improvement in accountability for expenditures of public funds
 - Enhance Congressional decision making through collection of objective information on effectiveness of programs
 - Promote a government focus on results and service delivery

Are You Making Progress???

SS/HS Requirements

- Collect data – baseline and annually
- Annually report data to ED/FPO and the NET
 - **ED/FPO: ED Form 524B Section A**
 - **NET: survey**
- Annually conduct an analysis of data (qualitative and quantitative) to assess progress

SS/HS Expectations

- Two sets of data collection in Year 1 – baseline and actual
- Activities, strategies, and services related to GPRA are not implemented until after baseline data has been collected
- All six GPRA measures are in the logic model
- Targets are established that are reasonable in relation to the targeted student population

SS/HS GPRA Measures

Student Victimization / Perception of School Safety

% of grantees that experience a decrease in students who did not go to school on 1 or more days during the past 30 days because they felt unsafe at school or on their way to and from school

% of grantees that experience a decrease in students who have been in a physical fight on school property in the 12 months prior to the survey

- *Requires grantee to define physical fight*

SS/HS GPRA Measures

Student Substance Use and Abuse

% of grantees that report a decrease in students who report current (30 day) marijuana use

% of grantees that report a decrease in students who report current (30 day) alcohol use

SS/HS GPRA Measures

Mental Health Services

% of grantees that report an increase in the number of students receiving school based mental health services

- *Requires grantee to define school based mental health services*

% of grantees that report an increase in the percentage of mental health referrals which result in mental health services being provided in the community

- *Grantee should define community based mental health services*

Review of FY 2008 Reports

- GPRA Performance Measures
- Baseline Data
- Establishing a Target (reasonable)
- Reporting of Year 1 Data

Review Findings

- Measure had not been customized (e.g., target population of students, time period for change)
- Changed the measure from one report to the next
- % or number change unreasonably low
- Unclear if baseline data representative of target population

Review Findings

- Incorrect calculation of target
- Did not compute a target
- Missing baseline data
- Did not identify when Year 1 data would be collected
- Did not include Year 1 data (80%)

GPRA Steps

- **Step 1: Customize the GPRA measure**
 - Targeted student population
 - Measurement of change
 - Data collection instrument or survey
 - Time period for the change
- **Step 2: Calculate the target from the baseline data**
- **Step 3: Report actual performance data & calculate the actual performance change**
- **And**

GPRRA Steps

- Step 4: Explanation of Progress
 - Identify data and methods and types of analyses used
 - Identify deviations from evaluation plan
 - Describe preliminary findings and outcomes
 - Assess level of progress (e.g., none, partial, full)
 - Describe activities and accomplishments
 - If appropriate, describe obstacles, problems, lack of progress and steps for addressing
 - Describe how data is used to monitor grant progress

Explanation of Progress (Include Qualitative Data and Data Collection Information)

EXAMPLE –

Baseline = 345 students responded “yes” out of a total of 1345 students = 345/1345 = .2565 = 25.65%

Year 1 Target = 25.65% X 10% decrease = 23.08%

Year 2 Target = 23.08% X 10% decrease = 20.77%

Year 3 Target = 20.77% X 10% decrease = 18.7%

Year 4 Target = 18.7% X 10% decrease = 16.83%

Remember:

- The target % box will never change
- Since the change is being measured by a percentage, the raw number box should never be used
- Grantees should provide data for both the ratio box (numerator and denominator) and the % box

Helpful Hints

CUSTOMIZING GPRA MEASURES

- ✓ Was each measure worded correctly?
- ✓ Was each measure “customized
- ✓ Does GPRA 2, 5, and 6 include required definitions?
- ✓ Was the target # or % change revised after baseline was collected?
- ✓ Was each measure the same for both reports?

Helpful Hints

COLLECTING and REPORTING BASELINE DATA

- ✓ Was data collected prior to implementation?
- ✓ Did data include both a numerator and denominator (% change – GPRA 1, 2, 3, 4, 6)?
- ✓ Was data reported as a whole number (# change – GPRA 5)?

Helpful Hints

ESTABLISHING A TARGET

- ✓ Did the target % go out at least 1 decimal point?
- ✓ Was the target expressed as a whole number (if a # target change – GPRA 5)?
- ✓ Was the target expressed as a % change (if % target change – GPRA 1, 2, 3, 5, 6)?

Helpful Hints

REPORTING YEAR 1 DATA

- ✓ Was data collected annually?
- ✓ If a % target change, did the actual data include both a numerator and denominator
- ✓ If a # change, was the actual data a whole number?
