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Purpose of the Scan

- Ensures that the Strategic Plan responds to current needs & builds upon existing programs, services, and resources
- Develops a more comprehensive picture of the early childhood serving environment at all levels
- Stimulates a thoughtful analysis of gaps, duplication and challenges
- Serves as a "living document" that may expand in scope over course of project





Scan Overview

- Environmental Scanning & Strategic Planning Guidance describes expectations and includes requirements
- State and local programs communicate with each other during the scan process to share what is being learned
- State and local programs each submit a scan
- Tribal grantees submit one scan





Scanning Process

- 1. Developing a scan approach
- 2. Scanning the environment
- 3. Analyzing the data collected





Stakeholder Participation Section describes:

- Who participated
- How were they engaged
- How diverse perspectives were ensured
- How scan provided opportunities for council development and involvement





Methodology section provides:

- Description of methods used for gathering data
- How grantee explored and used existing scans at the state (e.g., ECCS) and local level





Scan Data

- Collected information across program, providers, services
- Scan domains
 - Family Support and Parenting Education
 - MH and Social Emotional Wellness
 - Early Care and Education
 - Primary Care
 - Systems Development
- Scan domains do not map on directly with EBPs
- Templates
 - Use as inventory of data and submit
 - Use of additional or other instruments confer with FPO
 - Provide accompanying questions to stimulate thinking no need PROJECT to respond to all questions

Successes and Challenges section includes:

 Emphasis on the *process* of conducting the scan and successes and challenges that emerged



 Summary of factors that facilitated the scan process and of the challenges faced

SAMHSA reviews this section with an eye towards refining the guidance



Findings section:

- Is *not* a summary of data
- Outlines conclusions drawn that may more clearly define project goals and objectives
