Immigrants, an asset to the Lennox School District



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(LSSA)

Lennox, California

- 1.3 square mile radius
- Unincorporated, politically underrepresented part of Los Angeles County
- "Port of Entry" area Lennox 1st stop in U.S.
- More than 45,000 residents
- 95% Hispanic/Latino

- Nearly 65% of Lennox residents (most from Mexico and Central America) have resided in U.S. less than 5 years.
- More than 85% of Lennox families are Spanish language dominant.
- 95% of student population qualify for free/reduced cost lunches.
- As many as 35% of Lennox families live in sub-standard conditions.

Lennox School District

- Five elementary schools total 3,764 K-5th grade students
- Lennox Middle School (LMS6 and LMS 7/8) 1,972 students
- 3 school readiness centers (4th will open this Fall)
 population birth to 4 years old 150 families
- Preschool program approx. 550 families
- 92% Latino
- Immigrant community
- School district provides services to entire community

How does Lennox School District address immigration issues?

- Bilingual staff almost every teacher and all administrators and office staff speak Spanish requirement for employment
- Welcoming environment for students and families
- School staff culturally understand families
- Every school has a school counselor who is bilingual
- Intake process of new students academic screening in English and Spanish

- During student intake seek place of birth and number of years in the country to determine the best way to serve student and family i.e. needs for housing, medical, dental, mental health, etc.
- Services sometimes provided free of charge through Healthy Start and collaborations with community agencies.
- District does not ask for any immigration documentation. Only ask for student's birth certificate but it does not matter from where.

- Every school has a parent center and parent coordinator who are bilingual. They provide assistance to parents i.e. English classes, community resources, place to talk, etc.
- District offers healthy start clinic that provides medical and dental services for families.
- District offers tutoring and academic programs during the day and after school programs until 6 pm for students.

- All communication that goes home is in English and Spanish.
- ConnectEd calls in English and Spanish, also addresses literacy issue of parents.
- District and community provides annual cultural events i.e. Cinco de Mayo parade, Lennox Family Festival and individual school/classroom cultural events.
- Involve families view parents as a resource.

- The district does not provide Medical services or partners with any agencies that do.
- These services do not work in Lennox because of the concern with immigration and documentation.

District views itself as the "service delivery vehicle" in the community

- As such it has successfully brought grants to the district to address risk factors of students and their families.
- District has established long term collaborative partnerships to bring prevention, intervention and other services to school sites.
- Having services on site at schools reduces barriers to service delivery.
- For example, SS/HS Lennox Safe Schools Alliance (LSSA)

Risk Factors of Immigrant Students and Families

- Communication gap between children and their parents as children learn English and assimilate and parents do not
- Gang Involvement/Community Violence
- Alcohol/Drug use
- Low academic level of students and parents
- Low literacy level of parents

Risk Factors continued

- Parents often work multiple jobs to survive, children are often unsupervised or given adult responsibilities such as caring for younger siblings.
- Students sometimes miss school to care for siblings or act as translator for parents.

Strengths of Immigrant Students and Families

- Strong extended family
- Support system
- Language use Spanish to learn English
- Children are resilient

How SS/HS - Lennox Safe Schools Alliance addresses immigration issues?

- Majority of project staff speak Spanish and are Latino/a
- Clinical translator for mental health therapists who do not speak Spanish
- All materials provided in English and Spanish
- Large parent component educate parents about violence, alcohol and drug prevention
