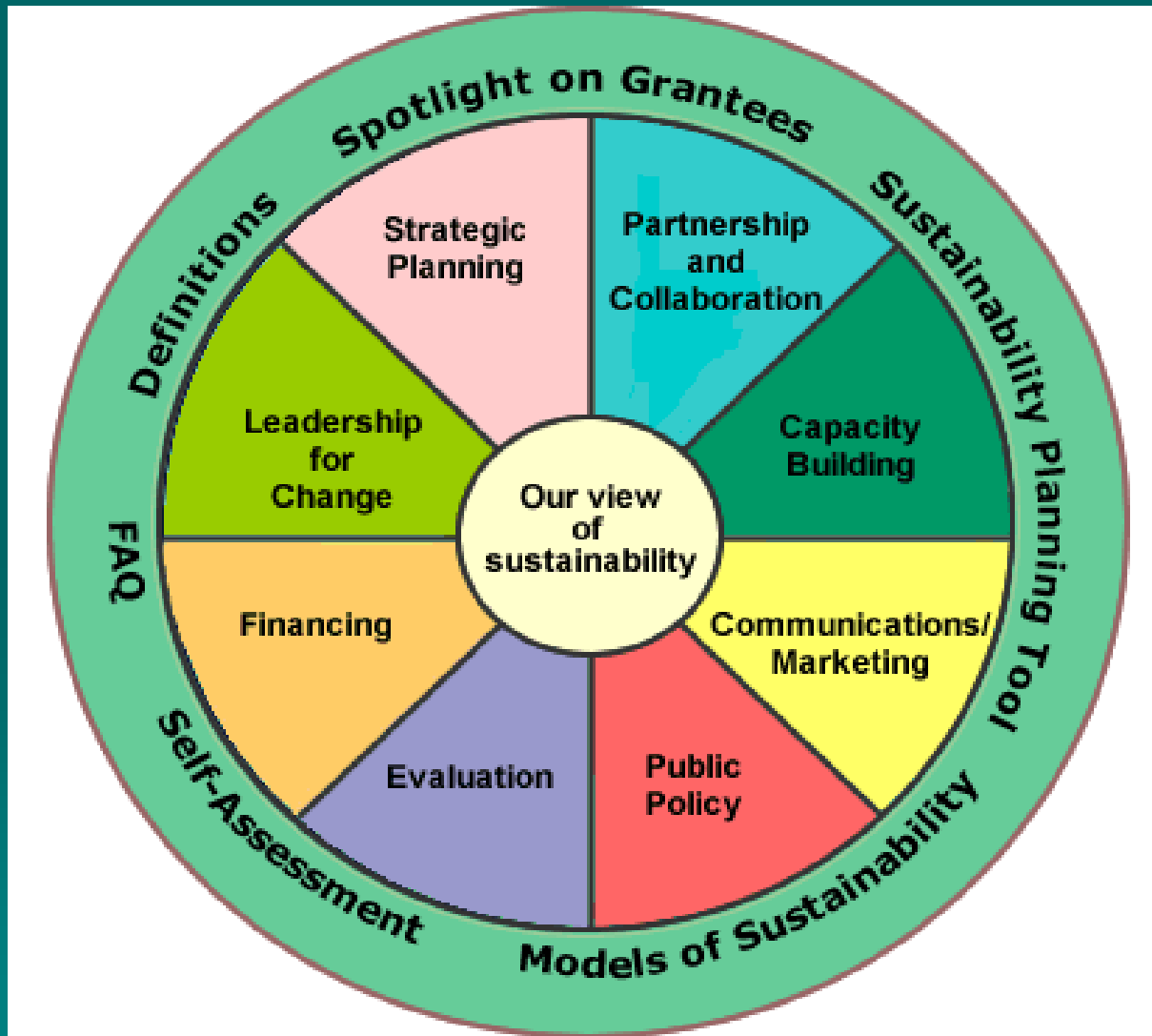


Implementation example from Utica NY
